



Merseyside Youth Commission on Police and Crime 2023:

Application Guidance Notes

Please read carefully before filling in your application form.

1. What is the Youth Commission?

The Youth Commission enables young people to inform and support, the work of the Merseyside police. The project allows young people to get involved and have their say about Police and Crime where they live across Merseyside.

2. Who can join the Merseyside Youth Commission?

We are looking for participants aged 14-25 years who are currently residents of the Merseyside policing area. The role is open to anyone in this age group living in Merseyside.

In total, we are seeking to recruit up to 20/25 young people. We are looking for people who will be good team players, who will be committed to the project and willing to do all the activities involved. We are also very keen to ensure that the Youth Commission is made up of a diverse group of young people who broadly reflect the makeup of the local population, including those who may have direct experience of the police and justice system.

3. If I join, what will I have to do?

Between September 2023 and March 2024, members of the Youth Commission will:

• Take part in Youth Commission sessions: You will participate in Youth Commission sessions. The first 2 sessions will take place on a Saturday. Other smaller meetings will generally be on weekdays (early evenings).







- Work on special topics: As a group, you will select priority topics to work on during your time on the Youth Commission. The shortlist will be determined by the Youth Commission and may include topics such as relations with the police, reducing youth offending, substance abuse root causes of violence, Knife crime etc.
- Gather the views of other young people: You will be given training and support to carry
 out peer research with other young people in schools, colleges, universities and youth
 groups. This can be done to suit your schedule and can fit around your existing
 commitments. We anticipate that each member will do in the region of 30 hours of peer
 research in total by the end of the project.
- Plan events: You will work in a team to design and plan interactive workshops to engage
 other young people and partner agencies in your area. You will be invited to help to run
 these events wherever possible as long as there is no clash with your school/ college
 commitments.
- Report back to the Merseyside Constabulary: You will contribute towards the analysis
 of information gathered from young people in your area and help to present back your
 conclusions to the Merseyside Constabulary.
- Help to host the Youth Commission Conference in March 2024: You will have the
 opportunity to present your findings and recommendations and be a part of discussions
 with key decision-makers from the Merseyside Constabulary, partner agencies and
 other young people.

4. What will I get from being part of the Youth Commission?

- **Discuss issues with the Police and key partners:** You will meet the senior police officers and other partners at Youth Commission events and help them to understand what young people in your area think about police and crime.
- **Develop your skills and experience:** You will gain valuable skills and experience, which you will be able to use for your CV or applications to Further or Higher Education.







- **Become a voice for other young people:** You will give a voice to young people in your area by helping them to get their views heard.
- **Meet new people:** You will meet a diverse range of other young people from the Merseyside area, and work alongside professionals from different organisations.

Filling in the application form

- **Section 1:** if you are under 18 you must also fill out the section regarding your Parent /Guardian /Carer. They will also have to complete and sign a Consent Form to give their permission for you to participate.
- You will need a named professional who supports your application and is happy for us to contact if we needed to know a bit more about the young person applying (This could be a teacher, youth worker, tutor, lecturer, support worker or manager).
- Privacy: Your privacy is really important to us. By filling in the Merseyside Youth Commission application form, you are consenting to Leaders Unlocked using your personal information to keep in touch with you over the course of the project. If your application is not successful, or you decide to withdraw your application, we will delete your personal data from our files.
